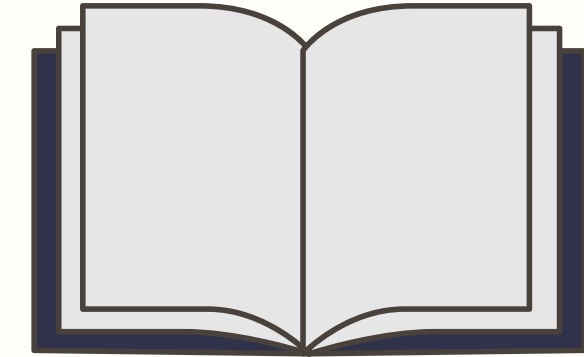

Chronic Homelessness (HUD)

Definition

- A homeless individual with a disability as defined in section 401(9) of the McKinney-Vento Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11360(9)), who:
 - Lives in a place not meant for human habitation, a safe haven, or in an emergency shelter, and
 - Has been homeless and living as described for at least 12 months* or on at least 4 separate occasions in the last 3 years, as long as the combined occasions equal at least 12 months and each break in homelessness separating the occasions included at least 7 consecutive nights of not living as described.

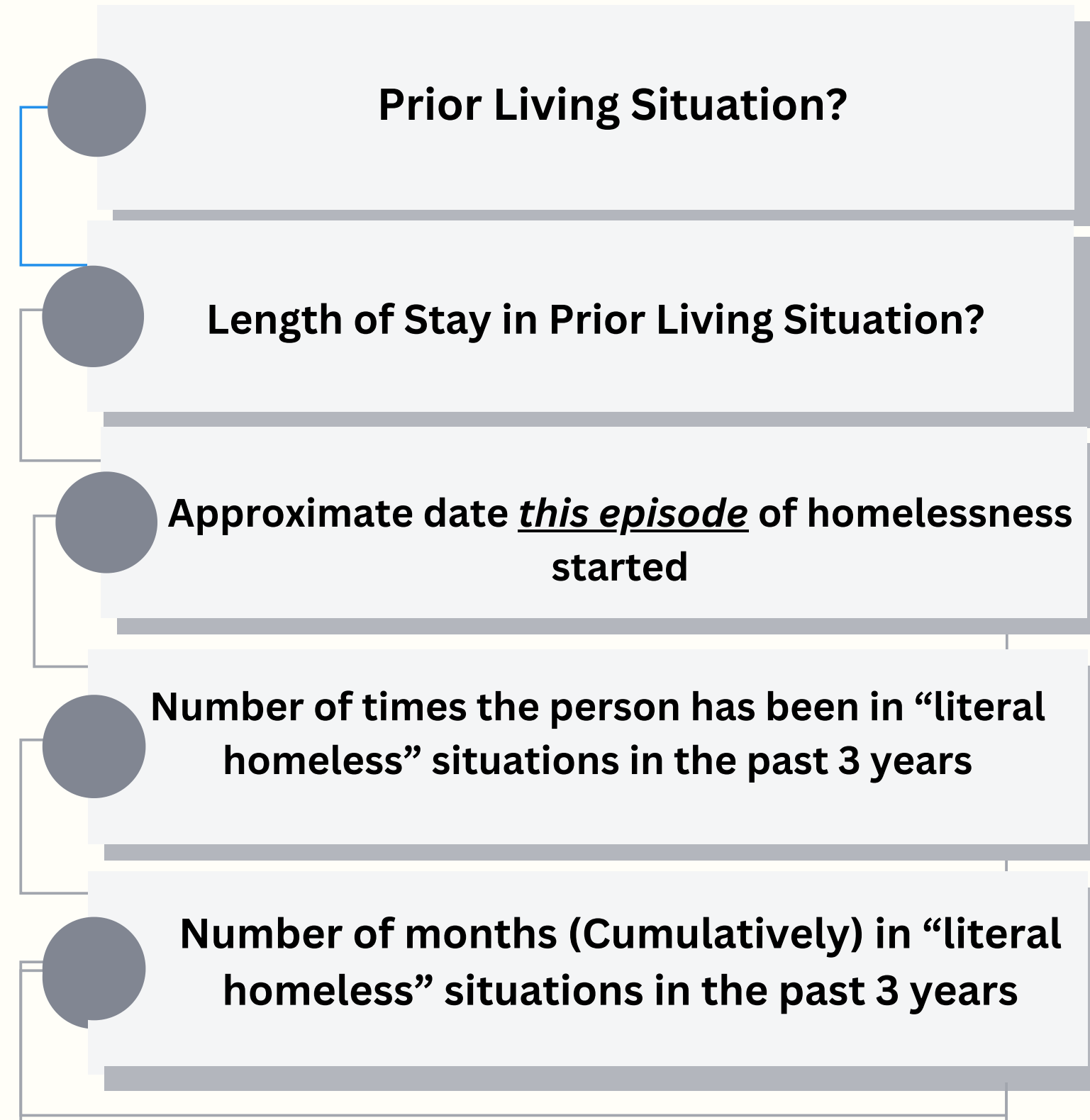

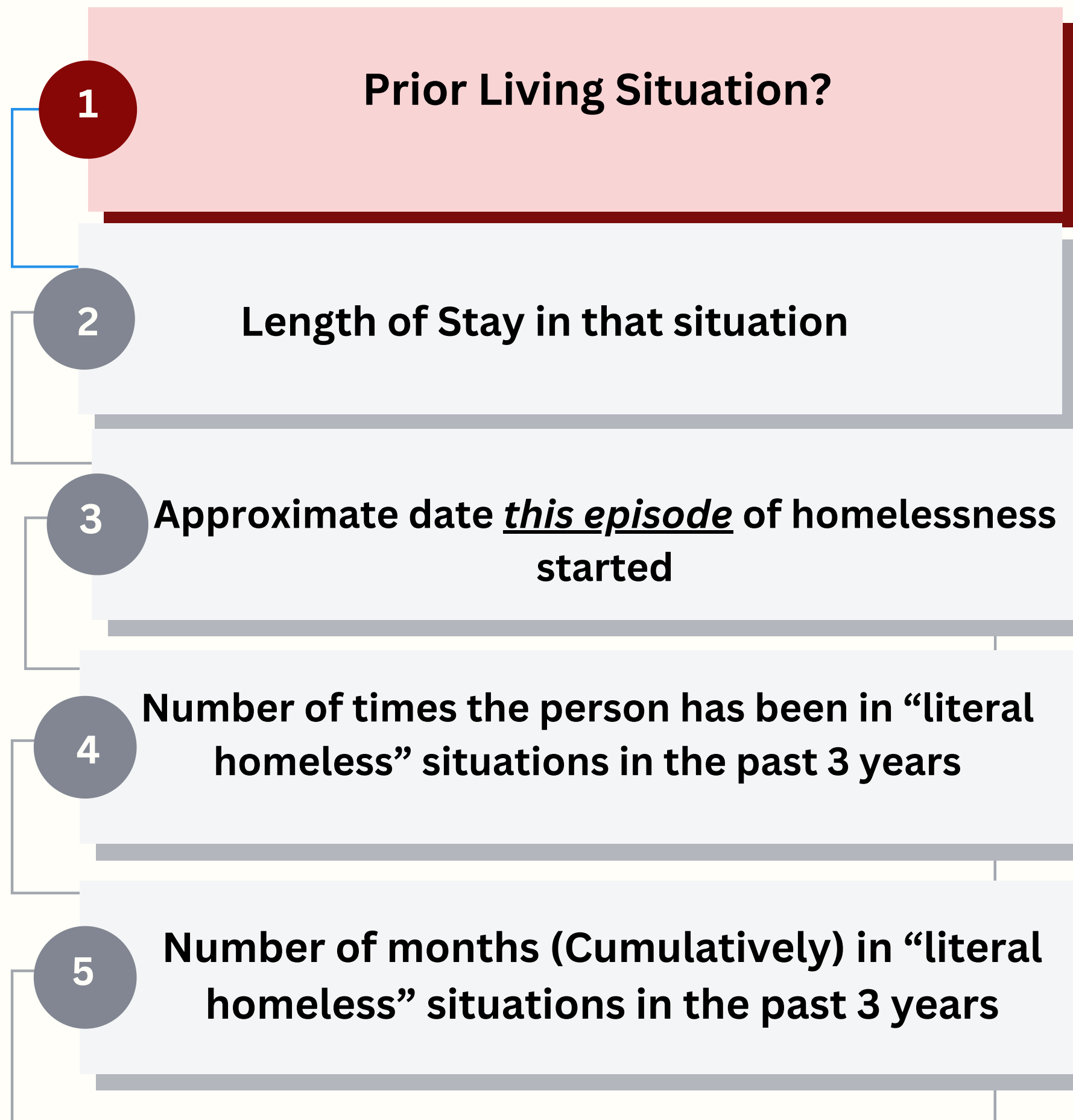
3.917 Prior Living Situation

Rationale

To identify the type of living situation and length of stay in that situation immediately prior to project start for all adults and the Head of Household. This data element is used with other information to identify whether a client appears to meet the criteria for experiencing chronic homelessness at various points of enrollment (i.e., at the point of project entry, at a point during a project enrollment, or at any point over the course of a specified reporting period).

The 3.917 Data Collection Flow

The 3.917 data collection flow is based on the how **Question 1** is answered.

If client is coming from a literal homeless situation, Questions 1-5 of the 3.917 data collection flow should each be answered chronologically.

Literal Homeless Situation

- Place not meant for human habitation
 - public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings, including a car, park, abandoned building, bus or train station, airport or camping ground.
- Emergency Shelter
 - Includes hotel or motel paid for with emergency shelter voucher, Host home shelter.
- Safe Haven
 - A project that offers supportive housing that (1) serves hard-to-reach people experiencing homelessness with severe mental illness who have been unsheltered and have been unwilling or unable to participate in supportive services; (2) provides 24-hour residence for eligible persons for an unspecified period; (3) has an overnight capacity limited to 25 or fewer persons; and (4) provides low demand services and referrals for the residents.

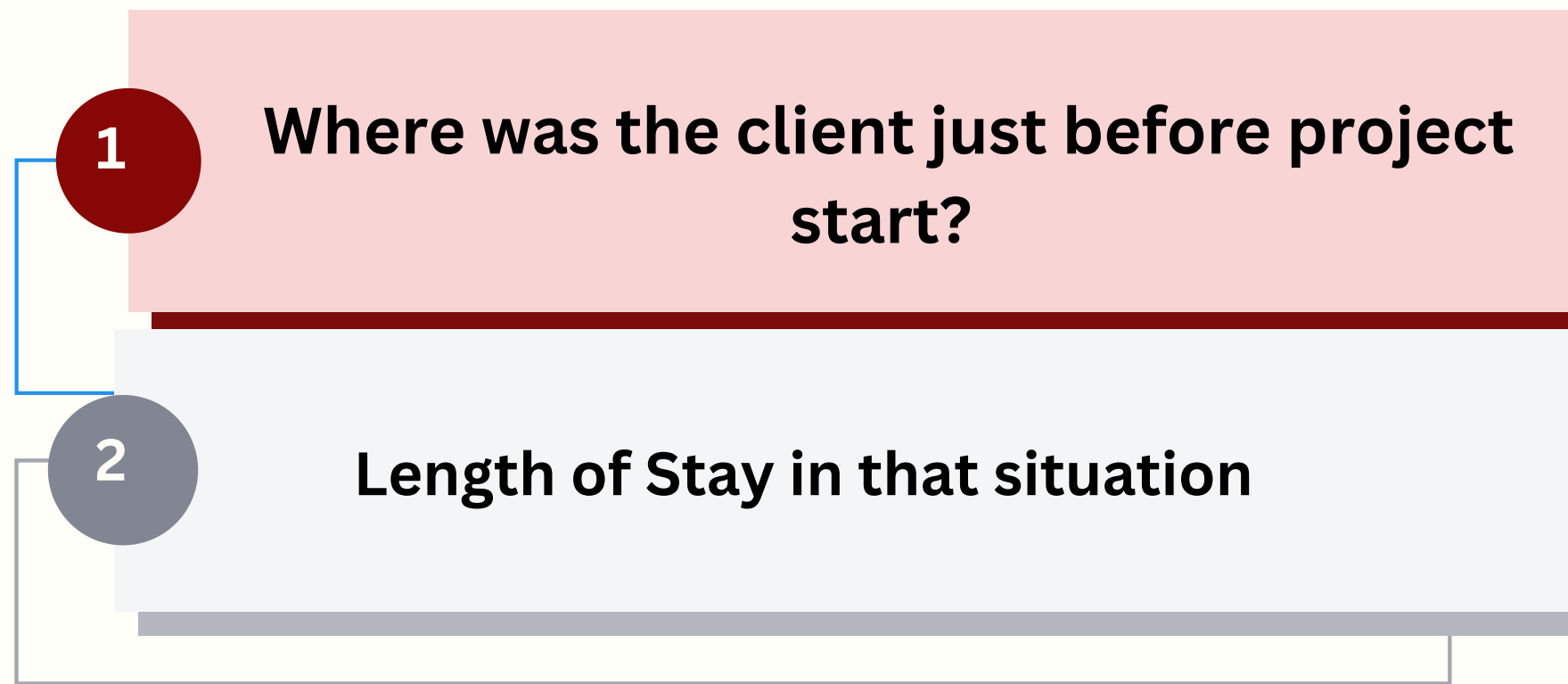

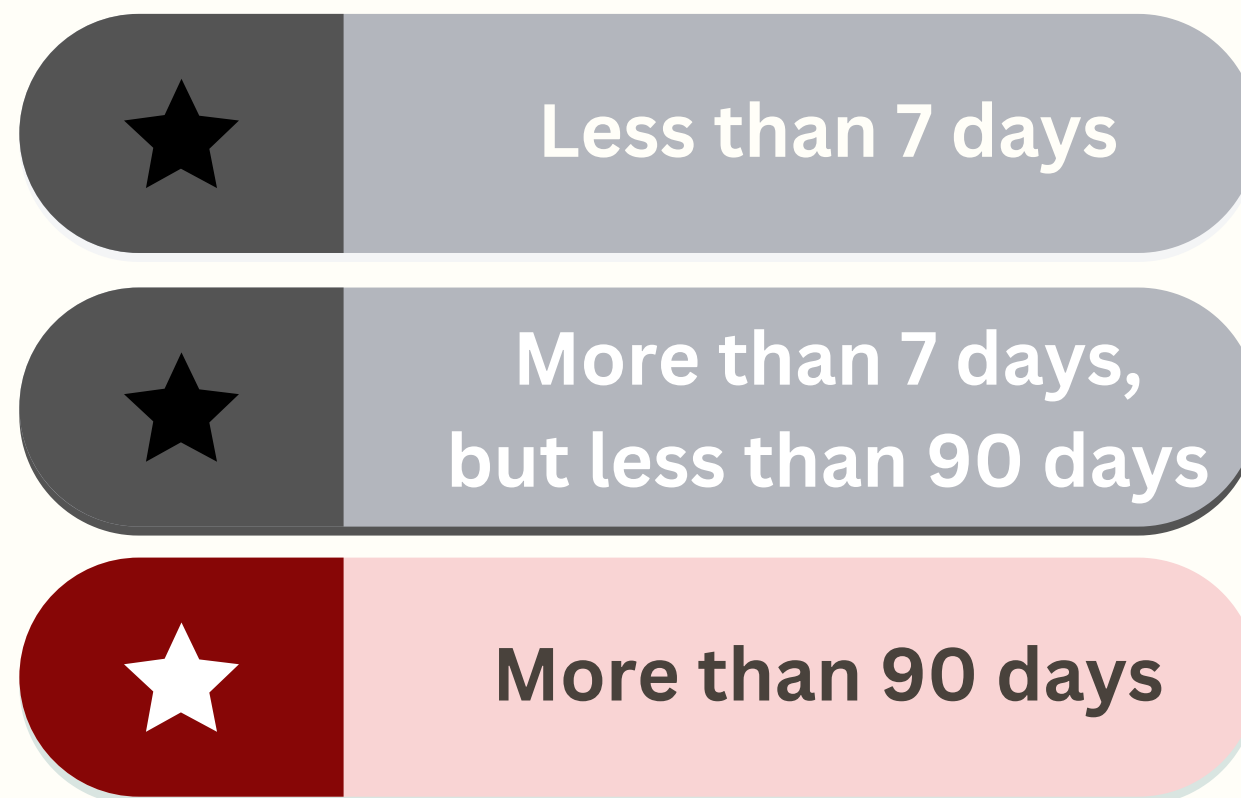
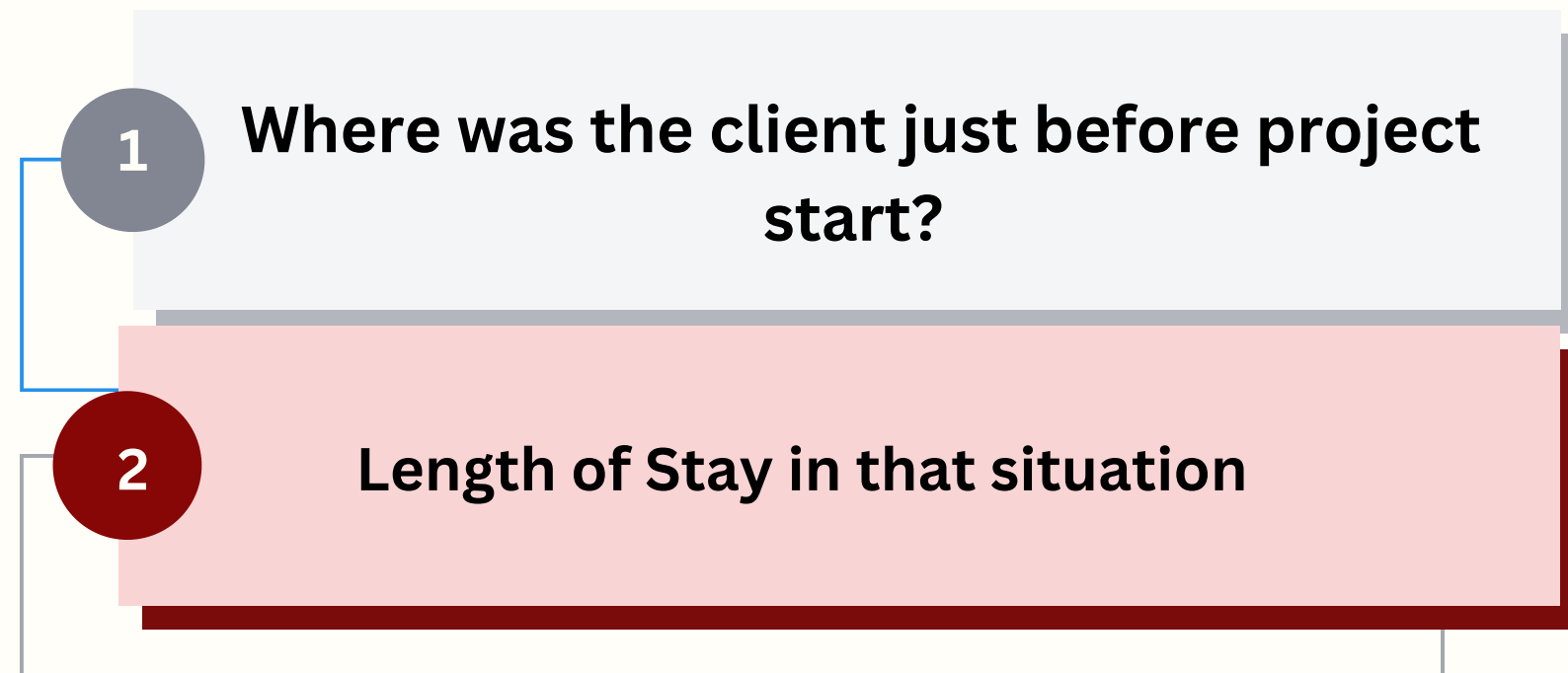

Depending on the client's prior living situation (1) and their length of stay in that situation determines the 3.917 data collection flow.



If Client's prior living situation was in an institutional setting for more than 90 days, no further data collection is needed.

But, Why?

“Breaks” in homelessness

In the previous example the client had stayed in an institutional setting for 90 days or more. This would be considered a break in their homelessness, and no further data collection is needed.

A break in homelessness is 90 days or more for institutional settings

7 days or more for temporary and permanent housing settings

"Break in Homelessness"

A break in homelessness is 7 days or more for Temporary and Permanent Housing Situations

Motel paid without voucher, owned housing, rented housing, permanent supportive housing, residential project with no homeless criteria, staying or living with friends / family, transitional housing

If Client's prior living situation was in a temporary or permanent housing setting

And their Length of Stay in that situation was more than 7 days, it would be considered a break in their homelessness

No additional data collection would be needed

If Client's prior living situation was in a temporary or permanent housing setting

And their Length of Stay in that situation was less than 7 days you will need to further investigate, and see what the client's living situation was before living in temporary or permanent housing.

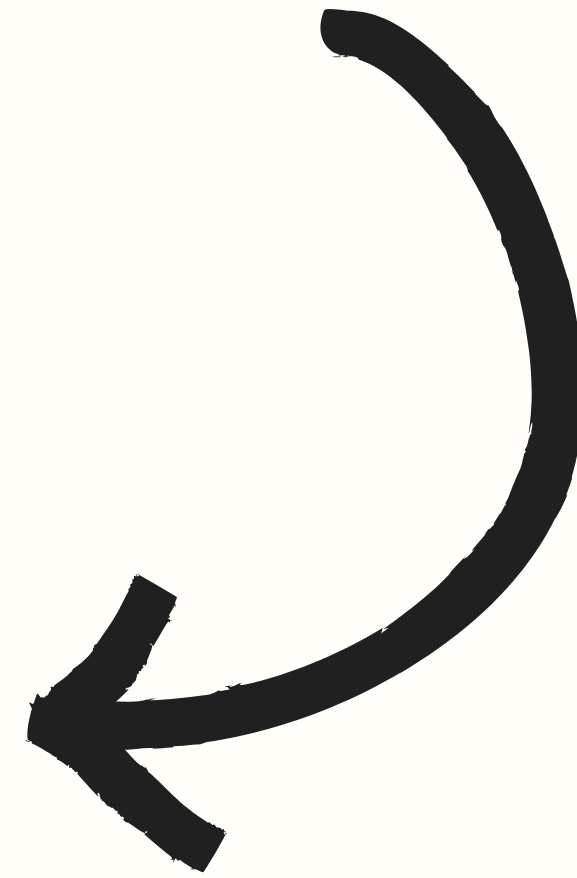

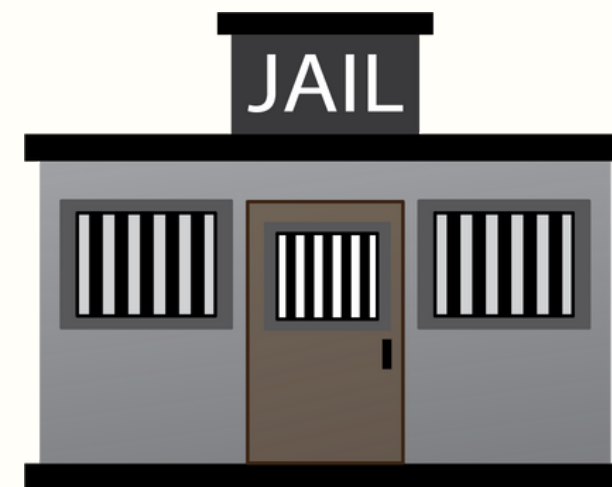
- **Have the client look back to the date of the last time the client had a place to sleep that was not on the streets, ES, or SH.**
- **Including the situation they were in right before entering, as well as any continuous time in the streets, in an ES, or SH. When did this time of homelessness begin? Determine the date this period of the client's experience of "literal" homelessness began.**
- **Review any breaks in homelessness.**

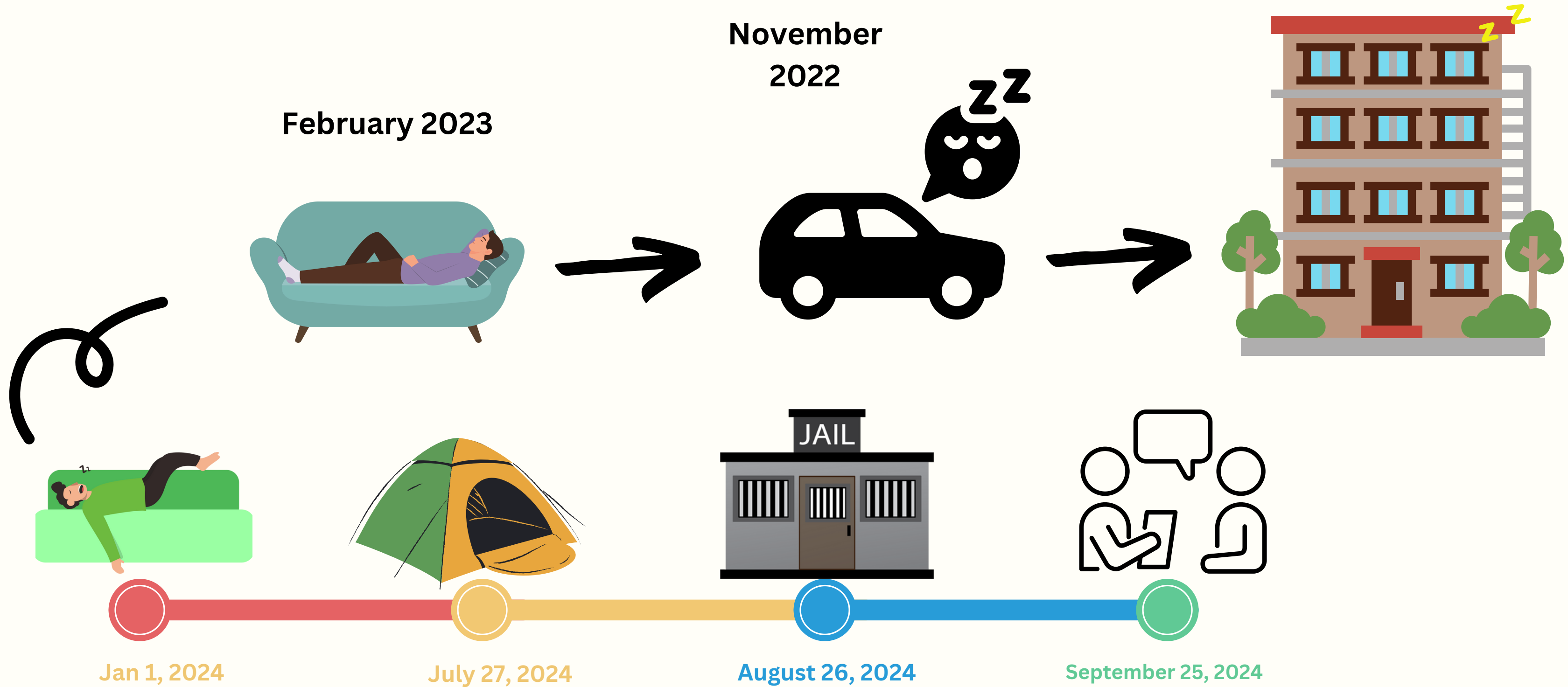
Number of months (Cumulatively) in “literal homeless” situations in the past 3 years

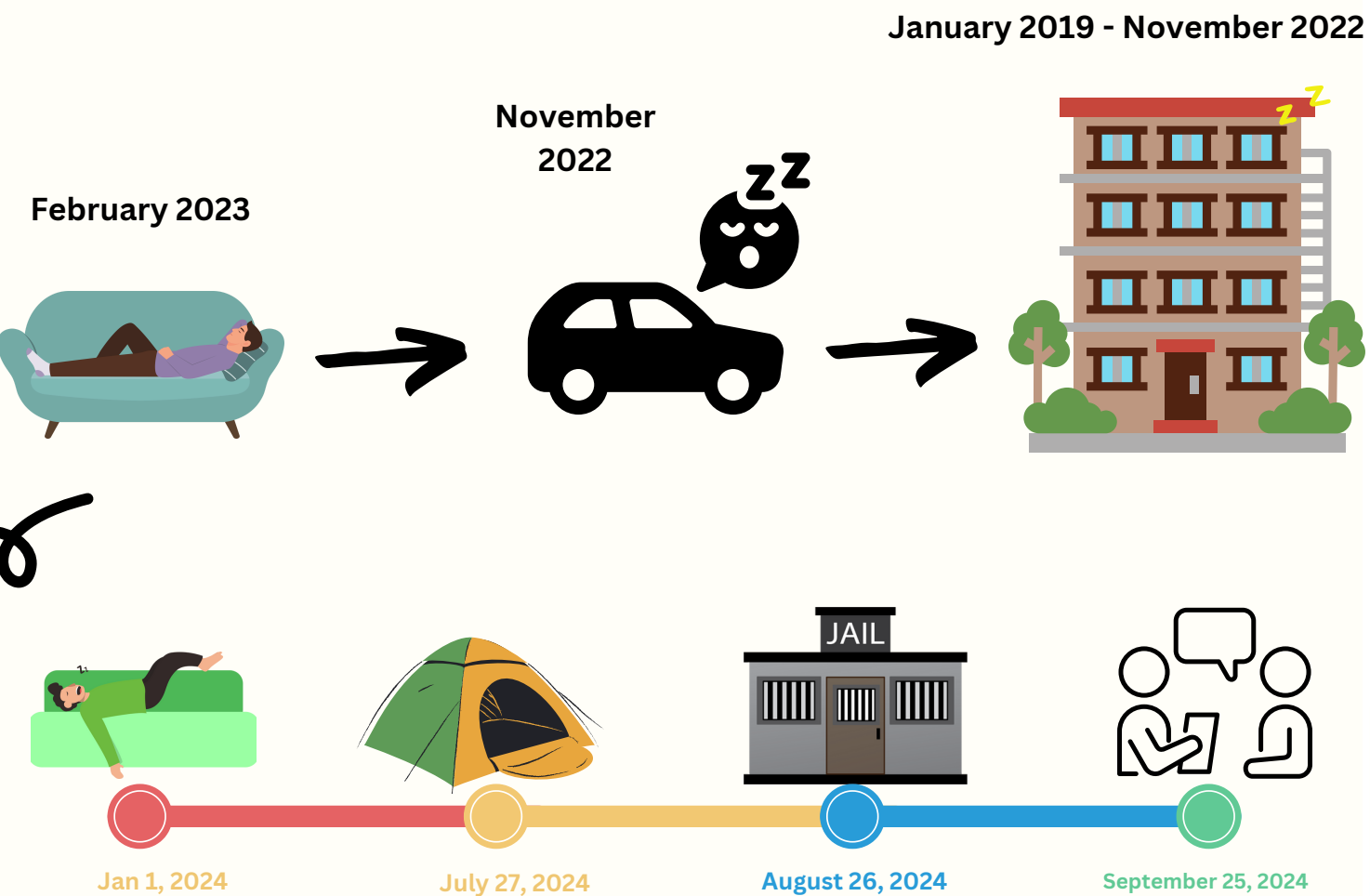
- **Count the cumulative number of months in which a person was on the streets, in an ES, or SH in the last 3 years, including periods where there aren't “breaks” in homelessness.**
- Pro Tip: the current month, even if a partial month, should be counted as a full month.

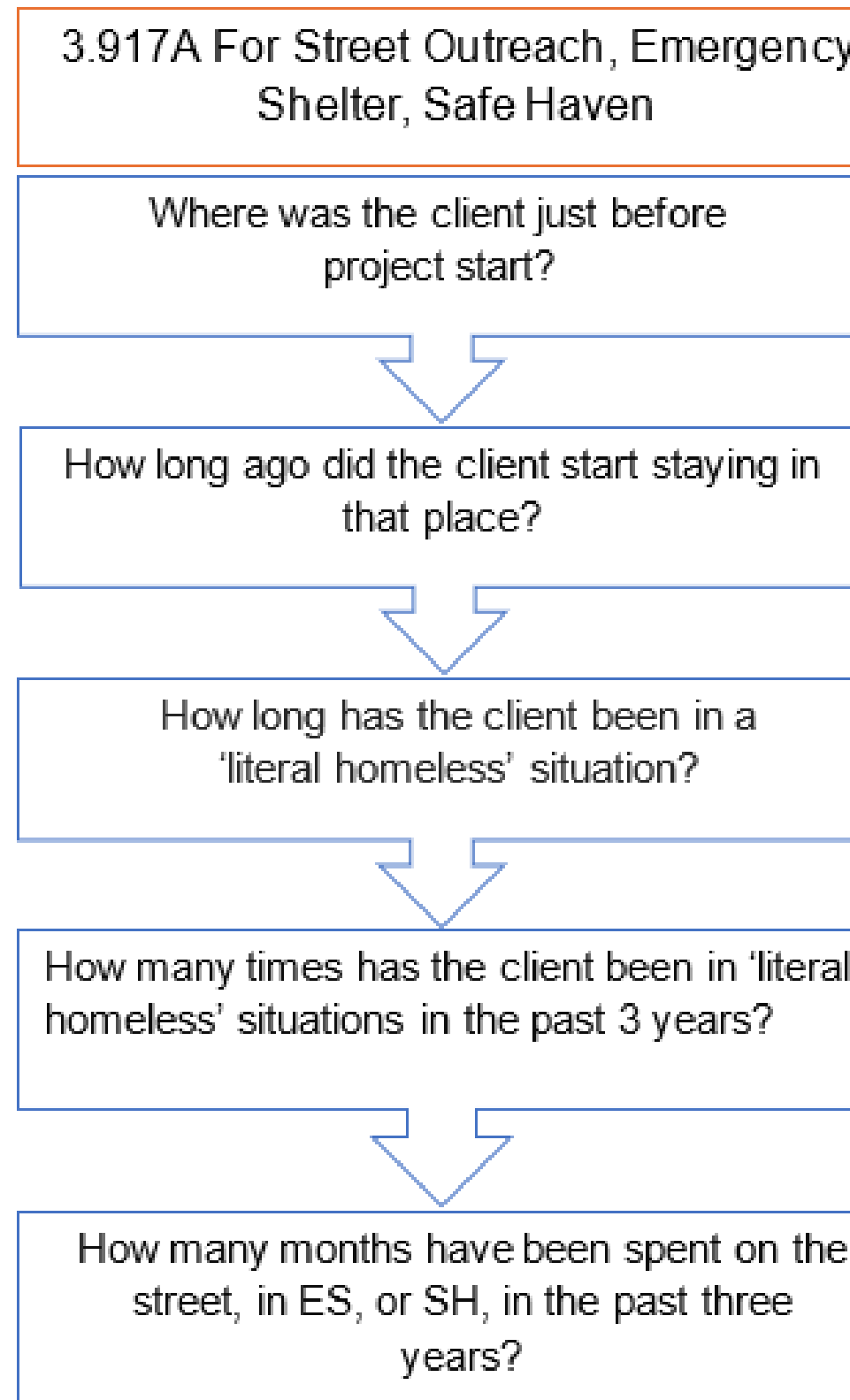
