

New Project Request Instructions

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PDDE 101 & Resources

Project Descriptor Elements (PDDEs) are the foundational building blocks for setting-up / managing projects in HMIS.

Regardless of an agency, or projects, *funding source* & **regardless of** whether or not the project *enters client data* into the CoC's HMIS, HUD requires CoC's to record PDDE information in HMIS **for all agencies** and projects in the CoC's Homeless Response System.

PDDEs for each HMIS project are entered and managed by the CoC's HMIS System Administrators in collaboration with each agency, *not* the End Users.

- PDDE's are created at initial project setup within HMIS
- Updated as changes occur to project or funding
- Reviewed annually with the HMIS System Administrators

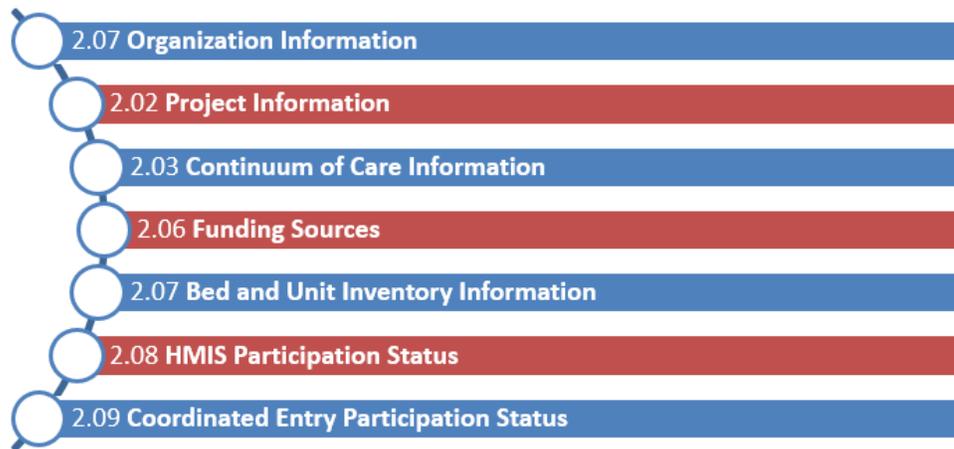
Agencies should refer to guidance provided by HUD for details on when changes to Project Descriptor Data Elements (PDDEs) must be reported; taking particular note of *HMIS Data Standard 2.06* – as it may require creation of a new project in HMIS, and the *HMIS Data Standard 2.07* – as only specific changes to bed/unit inventory need to be reported.

PDDE Definition and Importance:

Project Descriptor Data Elements (PDDEs):

- Contain basic information about projects in HMIS
- Help ensure HMIS is a consistent and comprehensive database of information about homelessness
- PDDEs are the 'building blocks' of HMIS & enable HMIS to:
 - Associate client-level records with the various projects in which clients will enroll in across project types
 - Clearly define the type of project the client is associated with the entire time they received housing or services
 - Identify which federal partner programs are providing funding to the project
 - Record bed and unit inventory and other information, by project, which is relevant for the:
 - Longitudinal System Analysis (LSA)
 - System Performance Measures (SPMs)
 - Housing Inventory Counts (HIC)
 - Point In Time (PIT) counts
 - Bed utilization reporting

Below is a visual of the required HMIS PDDEs, with each comprised of multiple sub-elements of project information:

To ensure that PDDEs are completed correctly for each HMIS Project please read the instructions in full & refer to as answering each question on the **New Project Request Form**.

What is Needed From You:

- Use these instructions to complete **HMIS New Project Request Form**, this will ensure that each PDDE is correctly answered ****much of the information can likely be found in the projects *grant/funding agreements*****
 - **If the selected 'Project Fund Source' is HUD: CoC Joint Component TH/RRH** – you **MUST** complete **two** separate form submissions, **1)** for the **TH** component **2)** for the **RRH** component
 - The form uses **conditional logic**, so certain fields will only appear based on previous form answers

HMIS Project Request Form Questions:

** HMIS Project Request Forms are to be submitted by the **designated Partner Agency HMIS Point-of-Contact** (PoC)

- Select appropriate response (Yes or No) to this question

1) HMIS Name & ID # of Partner Agency (as appears in the MD BoS HMIS)

2) Name of the NEW HMIS Project

3) Name and Job Title of Person Submitting Form

4) Email of Person Submitting Form

5) Select the LHC(s) the Project Provides Services In

- a. Southern MD Only: Select all the Southern MD counties this Project Provides Services In

6) Project Address

- Often this is the street address of the project's principal site – **or** –
 - For scattered site projects, the address in which most of the project's clients are housed
 - For tenant-based scattered site projects or VSPs, the administrative address may be used

7) Project Operating Start Date

- The first day on which a project provided (or will provide) services and/or housing
- Projects that are fully funded but have not yet begun operating may be entered with a future project start date that reflects the date the project will begin providing services

8) Does this Project primarily serve those experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness?

- YES / NO: Regardless of funding, and regardless of whether or not the project enters client data into the CoC's, is the primary purpose of this Project to serve those that are homeless – **OR** – are at risk of homelessness?
 - YES = This Project primarily serves those experiencing homelessness OR at risk of homelessness
 - NO = This Project does NOT primarily serve those experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness

9) Is this Project a Victim Service Provider (VSP)? *as defined by the HEARTH Act*

- Only select YES if:
 - Agency is defined as a Victim Service Provider (VSP) as defined by the HEARTH Act, or
 - A non-VSP agency has projects funded by FVPSA, OVC, OVW, or Specialized Housing and Services for Victims of Human Trafficking

Projects providing data from one implementation to another implementation are subject to the policies and procedures of both.

12) Target Population this Project Serves

- DV: Survivors of Domestic Violence - At least 75% of persons served by the project must be survivors of domestic violence
- HIV: Persons with HIV/AIDS - At least 75% of persons served by the project must be persons with HIV/AIDS

The PDDE Data Standard 2.07 'Bed and Unit Inventory Information' must be completed for the following Project Types:

- Emergency Shelter
- Transitional Housing
- PH – Permanent Supportive Housing
- PH – Housing Only
- PH – Housing with Services
- PH – Rapid Re-Housing (subtype: Housing with or without services)

- a. Please enter the Total # of beds in this Project (must match final calculation in Q16e – if it does not, you will need to review entries in Q16b – Q16d)
This will be the # of beds for the Project *as a whole*. In Q16b – Q16d, you will *breakout this whole #* and indicate the # of beds for *each HH Type*.

For Q16b – Q16d, you will indicate for *each HH Type*:

- Inventory **Start Date** (This is the date the BUI first became available)
- The **Bed Type** (Facility Based, Voucher, Other)
- And, for each HH Type, the inventory must be further broke-down to indicate how many beds are **Dedicated** to each homeless sub-population
 - The form will auto-calculate the # entered for beds **Dedicated** to each homeless sub-population – showing a **TOTAL # of beds for each of the 3 Household (HH) Types**
- # of **Units** for each of the 3 Household (HH) Types

Below are instructions for determining the **HH Type, Bed Type, Dedicated** Beds.

▪ **Household Type**

If beds can be used for multiple household types, they must still be reported in 1 of the 3 official HUD Household Types.

It can be helpful, especially for RRH projects, to record BUI using numbers from the grant agreements.

- Household with at least 1 Adult and 1 Child: Abbreviation is **A+C**
All Adult + Child HH must have at least 2 people. At least one member of HH is under the age of 18 & at least one member of HH is 18+
- Adult Only Households: Abbreviation is **AO**
Singles or Adults Only. Everyone in HH is 18+. Includes HH with only one single person 18+ & HH with at least one adult and dependents 18+
- Child Only Household: Abbreviation is **CO**
Everyone in HH is under the age of 18. This includes HH where there is only one single person under the age of 18 & HH where the parent is under 18 and has dependent under the age of 18

- **Bed Type**

- **Facility Based:** Beds located in a residential homeless assistance facility dedicated for use by persons who are experiencing homelessness
- **Voucher:** Beds made available by the homeless assistance project through vouchers or other forms of payment (e.g., tenant leased)
- **Other:** Beds located in another facility not dedicated for use by persons who are experiencing homelessness (e.g., church)

- **Dedicated Beds**

Of the total beds for each HH Type, indicate how many are dedicated for homeless sub-populations

- **Total Bed Inventory** (for each HH Type)

The total for **each** HH Type must equal the **Projects total** beds available as a whole in Q16a.

Example: This Project has a **total of 17 beds**. The breakdown of the total # of beds is **2** beds for Child Only HH, **5** beds for Adult Only HH, and **10** beds for HH with at least 1 Adult and 1 Child.

Total Beds = 17

- **Unit Inventory**

Unit = separate quarters (room, apartment, house, etc.) intended to shelter/house individual households.

Example:

- House with 3 bedrooms intended to house only 1 family/HH = **1 Unit**
- House with 3 bedrooms intended to house 3 mothers with children in each bedroom = **3 Units**
- Projects that **do not have** a fixed number of Units (e.g., a congregate shelter project) may record Units as the:
 - Bed inventory
 - Number of residential facilities operated by the project
 - Number of rooms available

17) *SEASONAL ONLY* ES Projects

If this a *SEASONAL ONLY* ES Project - you must enter an OPERATING END DATE that the project will end for the season
